

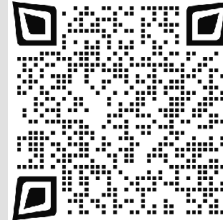
Washington State Winter Recreation 2025-2026 Season



**Wallowa
Avalanche
Center**

In Washington, Skiers, snowshoers, fat tire bikes and dogsleds are allowed on groomed snowmobile trails but should use caution and move to the side to allow snowmobiles to pass. Dog sleds and fat tire bikes are not allowed on groomed ski trails. Tracked ATVs are allowed on groomed snowmobile trails but wheeled vehicles except for fat-tire bikes are not allowed on any groomed trails. Grooming is dependent on snow conditions and many trails are not groomed for the entire season.

Avalanches are a significant danger in the Pacific Northwest. Understand the risks and check the avalanche forecast before hitting the trail. Washington is covered by three avalanche forecasting organizations,
- The Northwest Avalanche Center forecasts conditions in the Cascades: nwac.us

* Snowmobiles are not allowed on designated non-motorized areas, and are asked to avoid voluntary non-motorized areas. Snowmobilers are only allowed to ride cross country in selected areas: many areas restrict travel to designated roads and trails or to just groomed trails.

** Snowmobiles must be registered annually, vehicles are required to display a Sno-Parks permit at all Sno-Parks. These permits, that are included with snowmobile registration, are available as single-day or full season passes. The daily permit is accepted at all Sno-Parks, but a special groomed permit is required in addition to the seasonal permit at select non-motorized Sno-Parks.
